8-9am – Pick up from designated area

9.30am - Arrival at Jellurgal Aboriginal Cultural Centre, Tours & Information Hub located at 1711 Gold Coast Highway, Burleigh Heads, QLD 4220.

9.45am – Amphitheatre presentation of Traditional life pre-contact including information on Kombumerri Park Burial Ground & Jebribillum Bora Ring.

10.00am – Live Aboriginal Dance Performance, including fire starting demonstration

10.30am Burleigh Mountain Walk (Jellurgal Journey) including:

- Live smoking ceremony - A smoking ceremony is an ancient custom among Indigenous Australians that involves burning various native plants to produce smoke, which is believed to have cleansing properties.
- Anointment Ceremony - an important ceremony that is conducted by local Yugambeh men who will bless us with a safe journey.
- Dreamtime story – The Creation story of the formation of the Burleigh Headland.
- Guided walk to Midden (interpretive) - Shell middens tell us a lot about Aboriginal activities in the past. The types of shells in a midden can show the type of marine environment that was used, and the time of year when Aboriginal people used it

11.30am – Morning Tea on the Jellurgal Aboriginal Cultural Centre veranda inclusive of a packet of chips, sultanas and fruit stick. Students will also receive a bottle of water.

12.00pm – Yarning Circle with Jellurgal Staff Members

At this point students and teachers have the opportunity to ask questions.

Covering topics such as

- Dreamtime
- Pre-Contact, Contact and Post Contact including the stolen generation
- Australia's policies surrounding Indigenous Australians

12.30pm – Artwork shop, students will design and paint their own piece of Aboriginal Art to take home under the guidance of one of Jellurgal's Artist in Residence.

2.00pm – Farewells and Departure from Jellurgal Aboriginal Cultural Centre.
